The United Steelworkers and Environmental Defence teamed up to create Blue Green Canada, an alliance between Canadian labour unions and environmental and civil society organizations. Blue Green Canada advocates for working people and the environment by promoting solutions to environmental issues that have positive impacts on employment and the economy.

The alliance is based on the realization that a future sustainable economy must provide good jobs and protect the environment, not one or the other.

Blue Green Canada was formed in 2008 by a strategic alliance between the United Steelworkers and Environmental Defence, and now includes the Communications, Energy and Paper Workers Union of Canada (CEP), the Columbia Institute, the Pembina Institute and Tides Canada.

The United Steelworkers supports Los Mineros, the National Miners' and Metalworkers' Union of Mexico (SNTMMSRM). We stand in solidarity with workers and trade unionists in Mexico and their fight for labour and human rights. The USW has assisted Los Mineros secretary-general Napoleon Gomez, who is currently living in exile in Canada. For more than four years the Mexican government has conducted a campaign of repression against Gomez and Los Mineros, fabricating false charges and seizing the union's bank accounts. Charges against Gomez and Los Mineros were dismissed by the Mexican superior court in 2010. In 2012, the Supreme Court of Mexico restored legal recognition to Gomez. The Mexican government continues to deny Los Mineros the rights it is entitled to as a free and democratic union.
